Look:

Honeycrisp Apples have a tie-dyed look of red and yellow. When cut open, it reveals a creamy white flesh with small black seeds at the core.

Taste:

The Honeycrisp Apple has a good mix of sugar and acid which gives them their signature sweet and tart flavor.

Touch:

The outside of the Honeycrisp Apple is hard and smooth. The inside flesh is smooth, soft and damp.

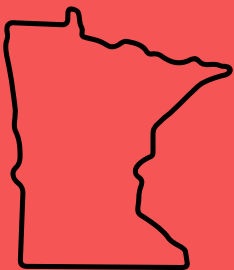


Honeycrisp apple trees are difficult to grow. Farmers have to handpick the apples multiple times each season to harvest the ripest, healthiest fruits.
